7	UPDATE FROM CLEANAWAY		
7.1	 Steve Davis provided an operational update: Facility operates 7 days per week, 6 am to 6 pm, with 13 staff members; Provided an explanation of current landfill progress and described the active landfill areas. Next three month predominantly in Cell 12; Aim to complete the western side of the landfill, then cap and rehabilitate; Discussion on dust management – visible to local community. Outcome, when windy, to run the watercart first thing in the morning; Discussion on odour – infrequent impact to the community; Litter collection – the site has a permanent litter collector on site; Traffic management – concerns with the odd truck driver's behaviour. Cleanaway has control over its drivers and contractors, but limited control over other non-Cleanaway drivers. Panizza Road is not a designated transport route for Cleanaway waste trucks; however, some non-Cleanaway vehicles use this road. 	Note

Activities associated with the after-hours vehicle movements are restricted to:

- Existing single floodlight at the weighbridge;
- Existing solar lights with timer/motion sensor controls within the site at transporter offload areas;
- Existing construction light towers fitted with timer/motion sensor controls
 operated behind a bunded area to lower light pollution impacts. It should
 be noted that no sensitive land uses are located within the impacted area
 and that the bunding effectively prevents light spill; and,
- Minimum operation staff on site, to a maximum of six. No office staff outside the hours of 6.00 am to 6.00 pm.

These activities are necessary for operating safely and securely and will be undertaken within existing Cleanaway management plans.

The site may be providing some of the soil fill for the Bunbury Outer Ring Road construction. This will reduce the visual impact of the site (stockpile removal).
 Some of the material will be backloaded to the road construction works.
 Construction scheduled to commence in 18 months' time, with a three-year construction period.
